

Lucky escape for 30 kids as school bus overturns

Bus Was Taking U-Turn When Car Rammed It

Hyderabad: As many as 30 children crawling from Kamalapur to Hanamkonda had a miraculous escape on Thursday after a speeding car hit their school bus, making it overturn.

While the car driver sustained severe injuries, three children of Ekantula High School sustained minor injuries.

The incident took place on the outskirts of Kamalapur village. Locals immediately called 108 service. After coming to know about the incident, police and parents rushed to the spot. Kamalapur inspector H Hari Krishna said the incident happened at 5.30pm when the bus driver was taking a U-turn and a

speeding car hit it. As a result of the impact, the school bus overturned. The bus was on the way to dropping the children home to Kamur village after school had finished.

Locals rushed to the spot to rescue the school children and alerted Kamalapur police station, said Hari Krishna. "The injured children were

shifted to the nearest hospital. Later, they were handed over to their parents. The car driver was severely injured, and we shifted him to MCM Hospital Warangal for treatment," said the inspector. A case has been registered under Section 307 IPC, charging with intent endangering the lives of others. Further investigation is ongoing.

Stalker kills dad of B.Tech student in front of her

Vijayawada: A 35-year-old physical education teacher at a private college stabbed and killed the father of the woman he has been stalking over the last four years on Thursday night in Vijayawada. He killed the man in front of his daughter.

Police officials said that the accused, Siva Manikanta, stabbed K Sri Ramachandra Prasad (66), a grocery store owner, six times in his neck and face with a knife. Manikanta fled from the scene while locals rushed Prasad to a hospital where he was declared dead on arrival.

The murder took place near Brindavan Colony Prasad, an resident of Chaitany Centre, was running a grocery store in the colony for over a decade. Police are yet to arrest the assailant. They have recovered the murder weapon from the spot. Manikanta came into contact with Prasad's daughter whom he was an intimate student at a college where he is employed. Both Prasad and his extended family had in the past warned Manikanta an multiple occasions were not to harass the woman, now a second year B.Tech student in a private college in Vijayawada.

Despite the warnings, Manikanta continued to stalk the woman and recently asked her to marry him but she turned him down. Prasad's relative again warned Manikanta in front of his family. On Thursday night, Manikanta stopped Prasad and his daughter on their way home from the grocery shop and stabbed him repeatedly. The daughter tried to stop the attacker, but he pushed her away.

"There was no relationship between them. We presume the motive was the grudge the man held after his family rebuffed him for harassing the girl," a police officer said. POL. Based on a complaint by Prasad's daughter, a murder case was registered against Manikanta.

Man comes home drunk, says wife branded him with burning wood

Hyderabad: A 23-year-old man in Sarangapuri of Himachal had ignited a complaint with the police against his wife alleging that she had beaten him up. According to Himachal 4-Open police, the man, Mahesh of Manchippa Thanda, allegedly

beaten his wife five months ago when he came home drunk.

In the past as well, Mahesh's family had also complained with the police against him for his drinking habit and asking him to stop.

But on June 23 when Mahesh again came home drunk, his wife allegedly lit his hands and legs with a

rope and pressed a burning wood on his body. Subsequently the wife crossed his wounds and stitches started at home, cops said.

On Thursday, however, after he was taken, Mahesh went to the police station and gave a complaint against his wife. Cops have now booked his wife.

4 acquitted in T'wood drugs scandal: RTI

Hyderabad: The Forum for Good Government on Friday urged CM A Nara Chandrababu Naidu to strengthen the prosecution wing to ensure that accused are punished.

FGG wrote to the CM after an RTI query by it to the state excise department revealed that four accused in the T'wood case registered by the excise department in connection with the Tollywood drugs scandal of 2017 were acquitted. The reasons cited by the courts in the cases is that the prosecution had miserably failed to establish the guilt of the accused, said FGG.

"Keeping in view the fate of the cases involved earlier, people have doubts about the legal conclusions of prosecuting agencies," said FGG secretary M Padmanabha Reddy. The excise department, in its reply said 50 persons have been acquitted, including 22 connected to the film industry. FGG stressed that a proper inquiry has to be conducted and accused have to be punished, it said.

Naidu releases white paper on Polavaram

Vijayawada: The extent of damage caused to the Polavaram project during the five-year rule of YSRCP is enormous and yet to be ascertained, said chief minister N Chandrababu Naidu. He released a white paper on Polavaram project in the chief minister's office on Friday.

He observed that the YSRCP government has put everyone in the dark without revealing the facts and the party continues to make false statements on the floor of the assembly. Naidu said that he was almost in tears after seeing the project in all his 36 years, during the TDP rule has gone waste because of the inactivity of Y N Jagan Mohan Reddy who stopped the works of Polavaram in the first day he took oath as chief minister.

Ignoring repeated requests and suggestions by the Central Water Commission (CWC) and Polavaram Project Authority (PPA), Jagan Mohan Reddy unilaterally changed the contractor without any alternative in place, said Naidu. The officials

from the Union government with him not to change the contractor but he ignored them completely. Jagan Mohan Reddy also transferred all the officials of state govt who have knowledge about the project. In the absence of contractor for about 1.5 years, the displacement work was damaged to 5000 people, Naidu said.

The gaps in collaboration would have been closed had the contractor been continued, said Naidu.
